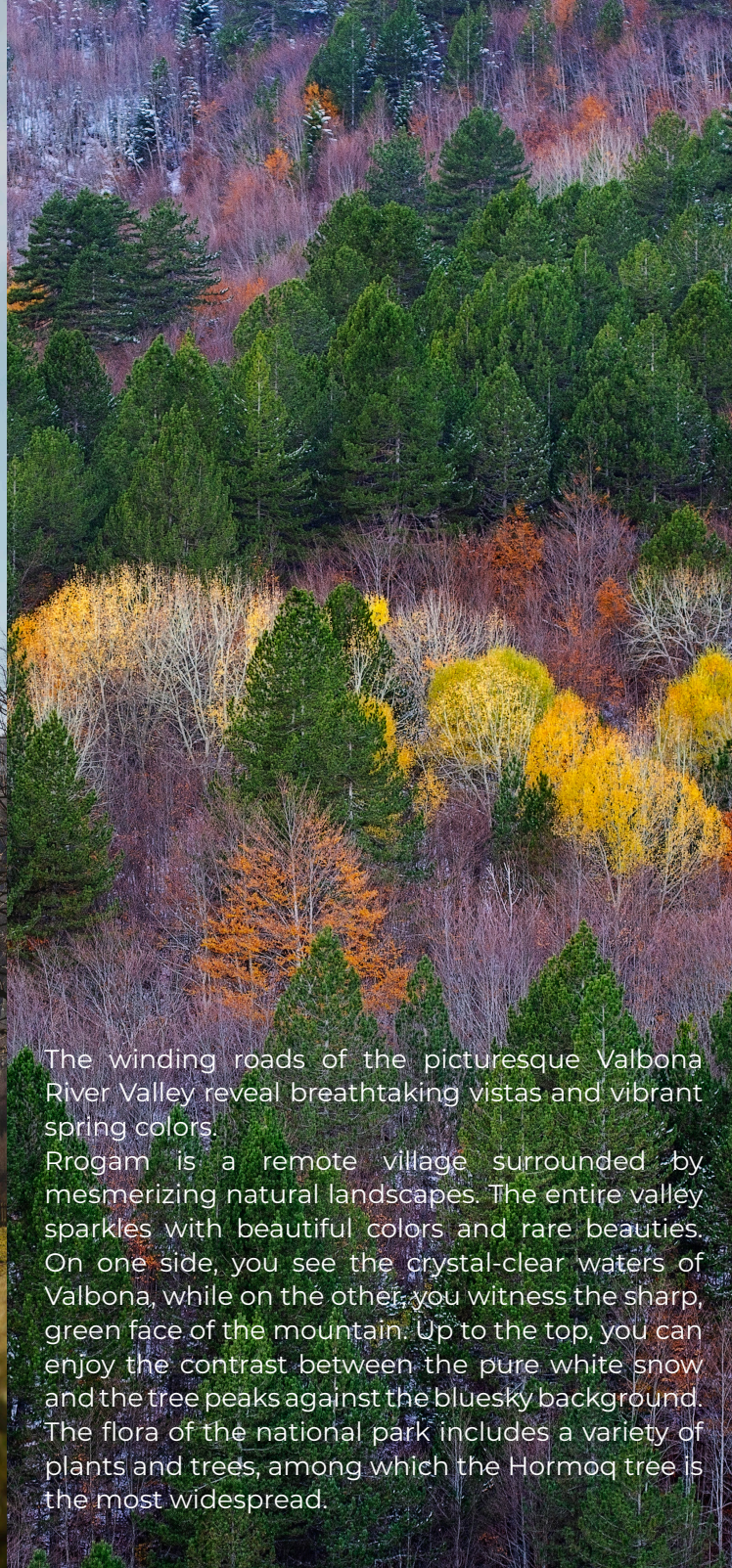


ALBANIAN ALPS

Accessing the renowned destination of Theth, 70 kilometers from Shkodra, requires traversing the impressive 2,000-meter Tërthore Pass before descending into the enchanting Theth Valley. Nestled deep in the heart of the Albanian Alps lies Theth, a quaint and picturesque village that feels like a step back in time. At the end of the winding mountain road, you will find a handful of charming homes surrounded by majestic mountain peaks and vibrant meadows adorned with wildflowers. Be sure to have your camera ready to capture the breathtaking mountain roads and vistas along the way.

Explore the stunning Albanian Alps, the crown jewel of northern Albania renowned for its mountain tourism.

This region features the pristine ecosystems of Valbona Valley, Theth National Park, Gashi River, and Kelmend's Mountains. Home to Albania's towering summits, including the breathtaking 2,694-meter Jezerca, this rugged landscape offers comfortable lodging options like cozy hotels and welcoming village homes.

Rrogam is a remote village surrounded by mesmerizing natural landscapes. The entire valley sparkles with beautiful colors and rare beauties. On one side, you see the crystal-clear waters of Valbona, while on the other, you witness the sharp, green face of the mountain. Up to the top, you can enjoy the contrast between the pure white snow and the tree peaks against the bluesky background. The flora of the national park includes a variety of plants and trees, among which the Hormoq tree is the most widespread.

The rest consists of beech, walnut, chestnut, and wild apple trees, along with many types of berries, blueberries, and wild strawberries.

At the northernmost edge of the Alps, Vermoshi also boasts stunning mountain scenery.

The Albanian Alps, including the Theth Valley, provide an unparalleled glimpse into the heart of this dramatic region.

From Shkodra, the path leads to the enchanting hilltop village of Razëm, surrounded by verdant pine and fir forests. Popular activities include mountain climbing, skiing, and camping under the stars.
