TOURIST VILLAGES







Albania's tourist villages offer the perfect blend of hospitality, dining, and activities, making them an ideal destination for your next getaway. With a wealth of picturesque and charming options waiting to be discovered, Albania provides a wealth of appealing choices for all travelers.

Seventy kilometers from Shkodra, in the center of the Albanian Alps, sits the charming village of Thethi.

Harapi Mountain, Katarakti Cave, and Grunas Waterfall are among the attractions. Both domestic and international tourists frequent Razma, a tranquil haven with breathtaking peaks and pine forests. A natural wonder with significant potential for mountain tourism is Lëpusha, a work of art in the Kelmend municipality. Nestled between the Valbona Valley and a series of precipitous gorges, Valbona-Tropoja is a wonder of the Alps.

Radomira in Dibra is a year-round tourist destination at the foot of Korab mountain, offering alpine pastures, fresh air, and water sources.





Kallmet in Lezha is an ancient village in the plain of Zadrima, known for its ancient settlement and the 13th-century Church of Euphemia.

Shëngjergj village in Tirana is a popular tourist destination with numerous water sources and lakes, offering attractions like the Waterfall of Shëngjergji, the Ruins of the Castle of Shëngjergji, the Cave of Vali, and the Mountain with Pits.






Petrela village, located 12 km from Tirana, is a popular tourist dest ination with the medieval Petrela Castle and the Tyrbja e Nuses.

Gjinar in Elbasan is a natural gem with cultural heritage attractions like Mali i Bukanikut, Shën Kolli Church, Valeshi Church, Gjinari Church, and natural monuments like Dushku i Lleshanit.







Voskopoja, an early medieval settlement near Korça, is a cultural and natural treasure with beautiful churches dating back to 1330.

Voskopoja offers visitors beautiful churches like St. Nicholas (Shën Nikolla), St. Mary (Shën Maria), St. Athanasius (Shën Thanasit), St. Michael (Shën Mikelit), and St. Elias (Shën Elias), whose frescoes were painted by post-Byzantine Albanian painters David Selenicasi and the Zografi brothers. Cultural, intellectual, and natural heritage are not the only tourist attractions of Voskopoja. Before leaving, make sure to taste traditional dishes like "lakror në saç" (a type of pie), roasted lamb, wild plum raki, or the city's famous stark apples.

Dardha, located at an altitude of 1344 meters, is a popular tourist destination with new buildings and contemporary hotels.







Boboshtica, a tourist destination with resources and biodiversity, is known for its natural beauty and hilly landscape. Rehova in Erseka is a picturesque stone village with stone and wood elements, offering traditional foods like dredhanik with nuts and fried pancakes.







Rehova in Erseka ia a picturesque village nestled at the foot of the Gramoz mountains and located just two kilometers away from Erseka. It is known as the "stone village" with back-to-back houses, each adorned with a porch. This village is marked by its historic doors, known as "Rruga e portave" (The Street of Doors), which are part of Rehova's Historic Center.



Tushemishti in Pogradec is a rare tourist village with 15 beautiful churches, four of which are cultural monuments.

Libofsha in Fier is a rare tourist village along the banks of Seman, with 15 beautiful churches and a unique architectural style.

Nepravishta in Gjirokastra is the largest village in Libohova province and offers attractions like the Castle of Melani, Teqeja e Melanit, and the Paleochristian Church of Manastir.







Soaking in nature, Llogora Tourist Village offers the perfect escape for those seeking a peaceful retreat.

Dhërmi, a coastal village in the Himara province, is known for its deep blue lonian Sea beaches, stonetiled houses, and red roofs. The village is home to the monastery of Shën Teodor and Alevrat Beach, attracting both locals and visitors.







Zvërneci, an island village near the Narta Lagoon in Vlora, is a cultural and religious heritage site with Byzantine architectural style.

Vunoi, the pearl on the Ionian, is a coastal village with small blue beaches and a historic church.

The Coastal Village of Lukova one of the characteristic villages of the Ionian Riviera is located between Saranda and Himara, 30 minutes





away from each of these two important tourist destinations in southern Albania.

The Albanian coastline harbors numerous intimate

small beaches with unique views and is surrounded by forests and green hills, perfectly harmonizing with the blue color of the Ionian Sea.
